

A. OPERATION

- Enter the batting cage through the gate, close the gate behind you
- Insert token. **ATTENTION! Only insert one token at a time - each token gives 25 pitches**
- Press the black button to start the machine. **ATTENTION! From the time the black button is pressed, you have approximately 7 seconds until the first ball is thrown - therefore assume batting position immediately!**
- **Red light indicates that balls are being thrown, a new ball is thrown every 7 seconds**
- When the red light is no longer on, no more balls will be thrown and it is safe to leave the batting cage / insert a new token

B. SAFETY PRECAUTIONS

- Batting takes place at your own risk, HGC is not responsible for any personal injuries
- The batting cage may only be entered and used after a conducted safety briefing with personnel
- Helmet **MUST** be worn at all times and must be put on / off outside the cage
- Only one person at a time is allowed in the batting cage
- It is not allowed to change batting position (left / right) during a game in progress
- Proper shoes must be worn (no slippers, flip-flops, etc.)
- It is forbidden to use the batting cage under the influence of alcohol or medicine / drugs
- Age limit is 15 years, children between 15-17 years need to be accompanied by a guardian who is responsible for safety
- It is not permitted to perform practice swings outside the batting cage
- Keep your distance from the net when the batting cage is used by another player
- Call personnel immediately if the machine throws balls outside the batting / strike zone
- Always pay attention, red light indicates that balls are thrown
- It is forbidden to pick up balls, this is done by staff
- It is forbidden to cross the ground line towards the machine
- Never stand directly in front of the machine
- Never turn your back to the machine
- Ensure that the gate to the batting cage is closed after entering / leaving the cage
- **WARNING!** Injuries may occur when using this machine. Players should familiarize themselves with the inherent risks of hitting baseballs
- If players have any questions about the use of the machine or the risks associated with using the machine, consult staff before entering the batting cage.

C. PLAYER RISKS

- Being hit by a thrown ball
- Being hit by a batted ball
- Being hit by a rebound ball
- Being hit by a bat outside the batting Cage
- Standing incorrectly in the batting cage
- Non-contact injuries when swinging (e.g. ankle, knee, etc.)
- Slips / fall injuries
